Student schedules

Grade 8 students: Students will receive their schedules in block A during their homeroom on Tuesday, September 6, 2022. Lists will be posted outside the school by grade alphabetically to assist students in finding their homeroom/Block A classes.

Grades 9 to 12 students: Students will be able to access their course schedule for the upcoming year on the MyEducation BC student portal starting Friday, August 26, 2022 at 4:00 pm. It is highly recommended that you save your schedule to an electronic device. Prior to the start of school on Tuesday September 6, 2022 please check back into your account to confirm your schedule. From time to time schedules are changed for various reasons. If after viewing the schedule you need to contact a counsellor, please see the message from our counselling department below.

If a parent would like to create an account, please contact the school office to provide their email address. Parents of Grade 8 students: Once this semester is in session, we will send home information on how to set up the MyEducation BC parent portal account.

If you are missing a course, missing a graduation/post secondary requirement, need your timetable balanced, and/or need some changes after summer school, you can fill out our electronic Course Change Request Form. Do not email or Teams message your counsellor for a course change; please use the form. This form will only be available from Friday, August 26th at 4:00pm until Wednesday, August 31st at 3:00pm. Please read the form carefully before you fill it out. Please do not email or message your counsellor on Teams regarding your request; if the requested change is possible, you will see it reflected on your timetable in MyEd BC. Instructions for Reserving Lockers Online

1. Go to the locker administration web site for the school: <u>https://tam.lockerassignment.com</u>

- Your login ID is your student number (refer to your go-card or your MyEd portal)
- your password is a combination of your initials and your student number combined. Your two initials will be uppercase. (ie. Adam Smith with student number 123456 would have a password of: AS123456)
- A map of the locker zones is included on the website

2. Select an area (zone) of the school where you would like your locker to be.

3. Click on a zone and the available lockers will appear.

• Green means a locker is empty.

4. Select a locker. Once you have selected a locker you will be able to see the locker combination. You will also be able to login at any time in the future to see your assigned locker and combination.

5. Once you have selected a locker, you cannot change it through the online application. This will be your locker and lock for this school year.

*If you require assistance with locks you may ask one of the Safe School Liaisons – Simi or Jon

There will be a student fee charged to students this year. The district continues to move towards a cashless system of paying fees. All fees this year at Tamanawis Secondary will be paid through the Cash online system. Lunchtime and the School Cafeteria – Wildcat Café

Our school includes a teaching kitchen with food service for students.

The school cafeteria (Wildcat Café) normally provides hot and cold meals during lunchtime. There will be no buffet style service. All food/prepared meals will be individually packaged for sale. There will be more information to follow regarding this service at Tamanawis Park. Food service will begin in mid-September. Students are not to share their food and drink items.

Parking – Student drop off and pick-up

To lessen traffic congestion in the morning and after school, we ask students to please walk or ride to school with a friend. Another alternative is for parents to pick up and drop off their student a short distance away from the school or at Tamanawis park. If you are dropping your child off at school, kindly be considerate of our neighbors and not block their driveways while picking up or dropping off your students for school. Please do not stop on 66th Avenue to pick up and drop off your child. The RCMP traffic officers have notified us that this is a concern of theirs with respect to student safety. In addition, we ask all students who are crossing 66th Avenue on foot to use the clearly marked crosswalks. If you are waiting for your child in our parking lot, please do not block the entrance or exit while you wait. Our parking lot often becomes a safety concern because of the number of parent vehicles parked in our lot and on 66th Avenue. We ask all drivers in our parking lot to be especially mindful of the number of students walking and cars moving during our busy drop off and pick up times during the day.

Health & Safety

Daily Health Assessments, staying home when sick, maintaining personal distancing when possible, frequent hand washing, cough and sneeze etiquette are all steps that remain in place in our schools and district facilities and help reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

For those who are able, vaccination and wearing a mask while indoors also reduce your own personal risk and reduces the likelihood of transmitting to others. Wearing a mask remains your personal choice.
