## ASSAI



**\$158,000** donation enables over 2,000 students from across the district to participate in sport and art-based programs, which aim to help students develop skills that contribute to a healthy life through creative thinking and physical activity. ASSAI's donation also helps support adapted programming for students with cognitive and physical disabilities.

## CANADIAN TIRE JUMPSTART CHARITIES

**\$118,000** donation to the District's Jumpstart Academy Physical Literacy program. This donation allows students across 34 elementary schools to participate safely in after school programming where they learn fundamental movement skills and the importance of healthy lifestyles.



## COAST CAPITAL SAVINGS

The lunch program provides sustaining mid-day meals that provides the necessary nourishment for our students to participate throughout the remainder of the school day and into after school activities.

Thanks to a **\$10,000** donation from the STAND Foundation, we are able to continue to run the STAND Foundation employment training program at our Learning Centres. This program provides over 45 students with the opportunity to gain important pre-employment certifications and skills, which will assist them as they transition from secondary school to post-secondary and employment.

**\$67,500** has been granted to Surrey Schools' Community-Schools Partnership department. This funding supports Community-Schools Partnership's ability to coordinate and facilitate improved access to school services for out-of-school time programming within our district.
