YoBro | YoGirl Youth Initiative – Surrey School District Program 2020-2021

In collaboration with the Surrey School District, Yo Bro | Yo Girl Youth Initiative (YBYG) is providing an extra-curricular program during the school day for youth. Information about YBYG can be found online at http://ybyg.ca.

Participation in the 2020-2021 YBYG program in Surrey Schools is a great opportunity to connect with an influential, positive adult who can listen to and relate to youth with the goal of increasing youth connection and engagement. There will be occasions to identify and adjust behaviors associated with risk and to make healthier life choices. Participants will also be provided with opportunities to learn and develop themselves with the goal of becoming fully prepared and empowered to contribute their personal best to society and to become tomorrow's leaders. Youth and YBYG mentors may participate in community walks, and dialoguing sessions. When Provincial Health Orders allow, there will also be the opportunity for physical activities to take place, such as working out in school recreational facilities. At such time, additional consents will be sent home for participants to be able to participate in physical activities.

Snacks will be provided, and staff should be notified if there are any food allergies or restrictions.

Participants participating in the YBYG program must follow the Public Health Officer and Surrey School District requirements. YBYG staff will be wearing masks during the program, and will be following BC Ministry of Health and Surrey School District guidelines which can be viewed at https://www.surreyschools.ca/covid19/healthsafety/Documents/Surrey%20Health%20and%20Safety%20Guidelines.pdf. If students are in the same cohort, wearing masks is a personal choice, and therefore parents should send a mask along with their child if they would like their child to wear one while in the program. Students participating in programs consisting of different cohorts will be required to wear a mask or maintain physical distancing.

Participants and parents should ensure that participants do not attend the YBYG program if the participant is ill including, but not limited to, symptoms associated with any respirator disease (e.g., the common cold, allergies or COVID-19). Parents must provide contact information to the outreach mentor and must be available to pick up their child during their child's in-person's session in the event that their child becomes ill during this in-person session.

DISTRICT PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMS - 2021

Surrey School District has formed partnerships with post secondary institutions to provide trades training and other training programs for high school students before they graduate. Students gain qualifications and test the career waters before graduation. Other benefits may include:

- **Dual credit** obtain high school and college credit (up to 36 credits)
- Complete Level One of the technical trades training
- Tuition is paid by the School District for most programs
- Possibility of paid work or an apprenticeship in the trades programs (16 credits)



FOODSAFE LEVEL 1 is a food handling, sanitation and work safety course designed for food service establishment operators and front line food service workers such as cooks, servers, bussers, dishwashers, and deli workers. The course covers important food safety and worker safety information including foodborne illness, receiving and storing food, preparing food, serving food, cleaning and sanitizing.

SERVING IT RIGHT and Special Event Server are British Columbia's mandatory self-study courses that educate licensees, permittees, managers and servers about their legal responsibilities when serving and selling liquor.
