Health and Safety



As a reminder to our school community masks have been mandated in our schools for all students in Kindergarten to grade 12. This is an added measure to keep our students, staff and community safe. We have been noticing an increase in the number of students coming to the office each day asking for masks. We are encouraging our students to bring their own masks from home, as we are running low on disposable masks. Masks are to be worn inside classrooms and in all common areas of the school. Students do not need to wear masks outside while playing. We are also reminding all visitors to our school to also please ensure that you are wearing a mask when you enter our school buildings.

Health and Safety Continued ...

Daily Health Checks

We are asking our families to continue to use and complete the daily heath check at home prior to coming to school each day. The form does not need to be competed and returned to school, but is a tool for you to check. By sending your child to school, you are verifying that your child does not have any of the symptoms listed and is well enough to be at school. If your child becomes ill at school or exhibits any of the symptoms on the form, we will be calling home as continued procedure.

When you call to let us know that your child will not be at school, we may ask you for your child's symptoms. This is not to pass judgement, but rather for us to keep track for cleaning and tracking purposes should it be required. Confidentiality is our utmost importance. There may be occasions where we as a school are required to report symptoms to our District Facilities and Health and Safety Departments.
