ELL/ESL Writing 10

COURSE SYNOPSIS:

This course is for students at the Developing to Expanding (high 450/460) level who are ready to learn the specific skills necessary for successful academic writing.

Units included in this course are:

- Unit 1 Introduction to the Writing Process
- Unit 2 Descriptive Writing
- Unit 3 Narrative Writing
- Unit 4 Expository Writing
- Unit 5 Persuasive Writing
- Unit 6 Compare/Contrast Writing
- Unit 7 Essay Development

Unit 1 - Introduction to the Writing Process;

It is expected that students will:

- > identify the steps in the writing process and parts of a paragraph
- use a variety of brainstorming techniques
- > organize ideas into outline formats
- produce a rough draft of a paragraph
- apply simple revising and editing skills
- recognize that different strategies apply to different tasks and time constraints

Unit 2 - Descriptive Writing;

It is expected that students will:

- use vocabulary appropriate to describing places using spatial order and sensory details
- > use the steps of the writing process to write standard paragraphs describing objects and places
- use new vocabulary needed to describe people, both physically and characteristically
- > use and put into practice listing order
- use and put into practice using evidence, both examples and quotations, to support character description
- > write basic character sketches

Unit 3 - Narrative Writing;

It is expected that students will:

- > analyze the structure of a narrative paragraph
- > demonstrate an understanding of the elements of a narrative paragraph
- > read and respond to questions from a sample narrative
- view and retell using their own words.
- > produce rough drafts of their stories
- > edit and rewrite

Unit 4 - Expository Writing

It is expected that students will:

- analyze the structure of a "how to" paragraph.
- > demonstrate an understanding of the elements of a "how to" paragraph
- use the writing process steps to develop a paragraph explaining how to do or make something.
- > analyze the structure of a "reasons why" paragraph.
- > demonstrate understanding of the elements of a "reasons why" paragraph
- > use examples and specific details to support topic sentences
- > use the writing process steps to develop a paragraph giving reasons why

Unit 5 - Persuasive Writing

It is expected that students will:

- analyze a variety of persuasive writing samples
- > demonstrate an understanding of the elements of a persuasive piece
- > differentiate between fact and opinion
- > state opinions and provide support
- use the writing process to develop both a persuasive paragraph and a "letter to editor"

Unit 6 - Compare/Contrast Writing

It is expected that students will:

- analyze a variety of compare/contrast paragraphs including responses to literature
- demonstrate an understanding of the elements of a compare/contrast paragraph
- > identify and sort similarities/differences
- practice compare/contrast paragraphs using the writing process
- practice a simple compare/contrast response to literature (i.e.-compare two characters or two short fables)

Unit 7 - Essay Development

It is expected that students will:

- apply knowledge of paragraph organization to the organization of an essay
- > analyze a variety of model essays
- > demonstrate an understanding of the parts of an essay
