

What is the EMHLR Project?

This resource emphasizes the science of mental health, knowledge about mental disorders that appear in children/youth, stigma reduction, promotion of help-seeking behaviours & the development of healthy lifestyles.

We aim to take the best available scientific evidence in mental health & make it easy to understand & accessible for everyone. Our team is committed to creating & delivering the highest quality Mental Health Literacy information, research, education & resources.




Where are we in the project?

EMHLR is a 4 year project funded by the Alberta Children's Hospital Foundation in 2019. Since its inception, we have engaged many educators, youth, mental health professionals & researchers in Canada & beyond to provide expertise & feedback to make sure the project reflects school & student mental health needs. The diagram on the right reflects the various project stages.

How can you help?

We are seeking feedback through field testing the EMHLR modules! We ask teachers to participate by implementing one module in a Grade 4 or 5 (or Grade 4/5) classroom. We will have follow-up questions for teachers & students around how they experience the EMHLR, including the content, delivery format & length of the module. This valuable feedback will assist the project team in creating a finished project more attuned to student & educator needs.
