### **READING RESEARCH**

Becoming a knowledgeable reader takes time and many experiences with many kinds of reading choices.

Skilled readers know that strategies for reading change with different purposes. When you're going to Greece on vacation, you don't read a pamphlet the same way you would read the same pamphlet to write a research paper.

Skilled readers also recognize that different types of reading materials will require different approaches in order to comprehend, interpret and evaluate what they are reading.

Motivation is also essential to becoming a skillful reader. Students who are not effective readers tend to not have a personal connection with what they are reading.

Learning to develop a purpose for reading that will benefit their personal life, requires reading away from the school setting.

Motivators include books:

- which are of personal interest
- as gifts
- about personal prior experi
- by favourite authors
- which come in a series



which have been advertised
which friends recommend

### GOOD READERS

Good readers read between the lines, making inferences and increasing their understanding. They use the information in the book to figure out the message.
