# Sick Children at School

As per our Code of Conduct, if your child is sick, they need to be kept at home. It is a Fraser Health



requirement that your child be SYMPTOM FREE for 48 hours and if they had a fever or 72 hours SYMPTOM FREE if they were vomiting, before sending them back to school.

Sick children at school increase the likelihood that colds, flu, and other infections or viruses will spread throughout the school population.

Fraser Health public health nurses also provide referrals for services and assessments such as speech, hearing, nutrition and mental health. You can contact your public health team at your local health unit from 8:30 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Monday to Friday.



# SNOW PROTOCOL

As the days get colder and the prospect of snow increases, it is timely to review the policies

regarding student and staff safety in the event of a heavy snowfall in the new year. The School district has some guidelines regarding school closures and general policies regarding snow.

The District standard is that the schools will remain open and operating as close to normal as possible except in extreme circumstances such as prolonged power outages, physical damage to a school and/or transportation route closures. The Superintendent will decide based on what is in the best interest of student and staff safety, as to whether or not individual 01-09-2020 schools will be closed. The decision to close is not taken lightly and will be made by 7:00 a.m.

If the weather appears to be particularly nasty, parents are encouraged to listen to CKNW News. 980, News 1130 or CBC 690 for information regarding possible school closures.

Please do not phone the school to inquire if we are open. It jams the phone lines and we are unable to talk with district personal and school staff. Please make sure you go to the District website and or our school website for updates.

Please try to limit your driving to and from school. As the back roads are often very slippery and not often ploughed, it is dangerous for our students if there is a lot of traffic on slippery roads around the school and parking lots. The parking lot to the north of the school is a City of Surrey Lot. The school district is not responsible for it. If you choose to park there when there is snow, know that it will most likely not be ploughed and you assume the risk if you get stuck.

It is important for children to be dressed appropriately-coat, hat, mittens and boots. Please be aware that the blacktop areas around the school are often VERY icy. Exercise caution when coming onto the school grounds. We make every effort to salt and do snow removal but remaining cautious will help minimize the risk of injury.

School District policy is that no snowballs are to be thrown before, during or after school. Students are made aware of these rules regarding snowballs and must obey them or there will be consequences as per our Code of Conduct.
