At our Remembrance Day Assembly, we will highlight the ravages of violence and the central theme for both Diwali and Remembrance day will be the importance of empathy, kindness and peacefulness.

Although Halloween is fun because it is spooky, costumes that depict violence scare younger children. In fact, costumes that rely on violent ideas can prevent our youngest students from taking part in school-wide Halloween activities. In addition, numerous researchers have pointed out that the normalization of violent depictions de-sensitize children to the reality of violence and can lead to an increase in aggression. Accordingly, we ask parents to think carefully about the costumes that are being sent to school.

Students will still be required to wear their Covid masks, so please do not send children with other face masks as part of a costume as it may hinder their breathing.
