

Our team has created posters and other activities for students and families to become familiar with our non-negotiables and be able to explain what they are and give an example of each. We will have posters in both French and English.

We have also decided, in an effort to bring more excitement to school community and school wide activities, to design and implement a 'House System' at Riverdale. Each House is named after a Canadian who represents an aspect of Canadian values and culture that we want students and community members to understand and emulate. Also, each house is associated with one of the colours of the rainbow.

The Riverdale House Teams and Colours are:



Teachers have been assigned to houses and students have been too. Students will get their house colours on Monday as part of our Spirit Week. Spirit Week is starting with "All the Colours of a Rainbow" on Monday.

The other days are:

Monday – All the Colours of the Rainbow

Tuesday – Tropical – Hats and Sunglasses

Wednesday – Sports Jersey Day

Thursday – Raven's Spirit Wear

Friday – House Colours Day – Students wear the colours of their new house.

As we look forward to next year we are going to start the year (COVID willing) in our house groups, learning about the non-negotiables and creating house banners and chants for our Welcome Back Assembly. We plan to meet in house groups throughout the year in different activities and assemblies. We also plan to merge 'Sports Day' and 'Fun Day' into what will be called 'Raven's Day', allowing us to keep some of the competitive parts of 'Sports Day' and the great parts of 'Fun Day' that we started in 2019. We recognize the value of both and see Raven's Day as being a way to give all students an opportunity to participate in the way that is best for them.

Your child will be assigned a House Team for Raven's Week and we look forward to using this next week as our Grade 7 students have created a 'Sports Day in a Box.' Classes will be taking part in these activities as class groups and collecting points for their house. Ask your child how it's going for them!
