

Updated Information for those returning June 1:

We're looking forward to seeing you all on Monday!

The schedule is as follows:

***Learning Hub:**

- This is only for the children of those parents who have declared they are **Essential Service Workers** and need 4-5 days a week
- This will be made up of two classes – a Grades 2, 3, 4 class and a Grades K, 1class
- Each class will be staffed by one teacher and an EA to support online learning and other learning activities
- The teacher of each class will prepare additional activities for these students
- Our teachers are each taking a turn staffing these classes so these students will have a variety of teachers throughout the month

By this point, you should have received an email from your child's teacher

1. What days your child will be attending school (all are coming Monday and/or Thursday)
2. Who your child's teacher will be
3. Drop off and pick up times – regular bell schedule for all at this time.
4. What to bring (and what to keep home)
5. Where to meet

We are asking that all parents simply drop their child off and not stay on the school grounds to limit the number of people we have around and to ensure social distancing.

Our youngest learners will be brought to their waiting spot by the supervisors at the gate, so parents do not need to leave their cars. We thank-you for your cooperation on this.

Please send your child with all supplies including snacks and lunch. We ask you DO NOT drop off any lunches even if this was your regular practice pre-spring break. ALL STUDENTS MUST COME WITH THEIR LUNCH.

Basic Health and Safety guidelines we are implementing (more protocols will be taught to student as we have students in the building and the need arises):

- Upon arrival at school, all students will be washing hands as they enter the classroom
- Hand washing will be done throughout the day and specifically
 - Upon entering any new classroom
 - After using the bathroom
 - Before and after any shared activity (for those in the building with classroom sink access)
 - Before and after eating
 - Before and after being outside
- For those students in portables, we will be definitely washing hands upon arrival at school and before and after eating or being outside
 - Hand sanitizer and Clayton made portable hand washing stations (ie: camp style water container and soap) will be used throughout the day for other transitions and activities
- Students will be accessing the washrooms by walking around the building at the back and entering the breezeway doors that will be propped open
- The gym entrance will be used only when students in portables are needing to access the building to wash hands using the PAC kitchen sink and the staffroom sink
- Parents WILL NOT be permitted into the building unless it is absolutely necessary
 - We ask that if parents need to access the building, they only do so through the main doors even though the other doors are open
 - We ask that you wait at the entrance and ring the bell for us to come to you
- Our playground will be open for our students only and a schedule will be created to reduce numbers at any one given time
- Recess and lunch times may be staggered to promote better distancing on our playground

What can you expect your child's day to look like?

As a staff we are looking at June as an opportunity to do some passion-based learning projects, art activities, physical fitness, and learning around proper social distancing and physical health and hygiene.

A possible shape of the day (this is just an example and teachers will continue to do their own planning with all students - face to face and online - in mind):

Morning – online learning for all including those who are attending face to face

- Teachers and EAs will be there to assist students with that work while also working with the children at home continuing online learning

Recess and snack

Mid period – online learning for all

- One or two activities

Lunch and outside play

Afternoon - Social emotional learning activities, fine arts, passion-based learning projects, inquiry projects, learning about health and hygiene, physical fitness

Children of Essential Service Workers:

Thank you to those who let us know the days you are needing. This has greatly aided in our planning. See above (Learning Hub) information for Tuesday and Friday. **Please note that the Wednesday is a deep clean day and all staff and students will be working and learning from home except those EAs who are staffing the daycare for children of ESWs.**
