
Dear Panorama Park Families,

Here are some tips to consider throughout the winter season:



1. Plan ahead; give yourself sufficient time and plan your route

- Traffic moves slowly in snowy conditions.
- Give yourself extra time; don't assume a clear path for driving and walking will be available.

2. Wear shoes or boots that provide traction on snow and ice

• Footwear made of rubber and neoprene composite provide better traction than plastic and leather soles.

• Wear flat-soled shoes with deep tread. Avoid shoes with heels.

3. Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles, climbing or descending stairs, and entering or leaving buildings.

- Move slowly.
- Remove snow/water from shoes when entering buildings.
- Use handrails for support.
- Try to keep your center of gravity over your support leg.
- Use your car for support.
- Keep your hands out of your pockets.

4. Walk on designated walkways whenever possible

• Avoid taking short cuts over snow piles, grassy slopes or areas where snow and ice removal is not feasible.

• Look ahead when you walk. A sidewalk completely covered with ice may require travel along its grassy edge for traction.

• Don't text or read while walking.

5. Walk safely on snow or ice

- Take short steps or shuffle for stability; walk like a penguin.
- Bend slightly forward and walk flat-footed with your center of gravity directly over your feet as much as possible.
- Keep your hands out of your pockets.

• Be prepared to fall. If you fall, fall with sequential contacts at your thigh, hip and shoulder. Avoid using outstretched arms to brace yourself.


• Bend your back and head forward to avoid hitting your head against the ground.

Families Travelling Outside of Canada

We are still receiving questions and wanted to clarify the information we have received about students travelling outside of Canada. For students re-entering Canada travelling with vaccinated parents and a negative COVID test, quarantine is waived, **but school is not included in the exceptions.** So, all children that are unvaccinated (including under 12) must not attend school for 14 days after returning to Canada. School parking and traffic safety

The Surrey School District makes student safety a priority in school buildings and on school grounds, including parking lots.

It is always a challenge for schools to balance the need for a convenient and intuitive traffic flow and parking pattern with the need to respect neighbours' driveways, neighbourhood traffic, city bylaws—and the most important consideration—student safety.

The challenge is considerable when you are trying to accommodate a sudden rush of often hundreds of cars onto a one-block, or even half-block, street frontage.

Considerable planning is put into each school's specific traffic and parking circumstances; however student safety is the most important consideration, even if it causes some inconvenience to drivers.

Therefore, it is important for the safety of your child and other students that parents and others who drop off or pick up students at school obey all posted signage and follow established traffic flow patterns.



Many schools in the district have one-way driveways, restricted turn lanes and designated pick-up and drop-off areas designed to keep everyone safe. Failing to observe the rules puts students as well as motorists at risk. With pick-up and drop-off zones in particular, it's imperative that drivers obey posted signs. It's inappropriate and dangerous to misuse these areas for even a few seconds.

Some schools also have rules aimed at reducing harm to the environment, such as requiring motorists to turn off their vehicles while parked.

Motorists who don't respect the rules can expect a visit from a staff member, volunteer or student reminding them to comply.

Tips for drivers

- Drive only part way—or don't drive at all! Most students are usually well within walking distance of their school, so arrange a "walking school bus" with other parents. It's healthier and green!
- Think 30! A 30 km/h speed limit is in effect from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. in school zones.
- Stop for school buses when their lights are flashing it's the law.

- Children who are driven to school should exit the vehicle on the side closest to the curb or sidewalk.
- Use caution when a vehicle in front of you stops as the driver may be yielding to a pedestrian crossing the street.
- Always yield to pedestrians.

Tips for students

- Walk, don't run across the street.
- Before crossing the street, wait at the curb and make sure all vehicles have stopped. Look left and right, then over your shoulder for vehicles that may be turning.
- Make eye contact with drivers before crossing at a crosswalk it's the best way to ensure they see you.
- Don't jaywalk. Drivers don't expect to see pedestrians away from intersections and crosswalks, so pedestrians are even less likely to be seen.
- Don't wear headphones, talk on the phone, text or use handheld devices when crossing a street.

- 5 degrees or below and raining
- Raining and so windy umbrellas will turn inside out
- Raining very hard duration and intensity is great
