## Dear Parents and Guardians:

I hope that during this unprecedented time of uncertainty posed by the COVID-19 pandemic that you and your family are safe and well. As we negotiate our Provincial Health Officer's decision to combat the spread by indefinitely suspending in-class instruction, we ask for your patience and understanding as we navigate this uncharted situation together as a community.

We know this decision has a significant impact on all but there's nothing more important than the health, safety and well-being of our students, families and staff. Our teachers care deeply about their students, and are committed to ensuring your family is provided with learning opportunities as they learn at home. We've been working together with our staff to discuss ways to shift to this new learning environment. It will take time for teachers and students to establish new routines. Please keep in mind that the Surrey School District will focus on literacy and numeracy learning opportunities. Clearly, we are unable to provide a full day of acadmic work as this would be overwhelming for children and families, and is not realistic or necessary at this time. Unfortunately, it is not possible to replicate the entire classroom and school experience at home.

I realize, first hand, the challenges of juggling children, managing a household, working from home and remote schooling all while dealing with the stress during these very challenging times. As such, we will be 'easing' into our approach for home learning. Our first task is to ensure that we are able to make contact with you at home. Please be sure to check and respond to all emails, alerts, FreshGrade and DOJO posts and to answer any phone calls. Your child's teacher or another staff member may be trying to make contact with you from private numbers. Our aim is to reach out to all of our families by the end of this week. Our second task, will be to attempt to provide access to technology for those children who may not have computers or other devices at home. We have limited resources, but will happily work with families to make sure students have access to the technology they need.
