Year-end Report Cards:

Students will be invited to come in on Thursday, June 25th (our last day) to say good-bye to their teachers and pick up their report cards. Teachers will be available from 9am - noon and 1pm - 2:30pm on the playground area for students to come and say good-bye and pick up their reports. All reports not picked up will be mailed.

At this time, we still have 31 student belongings bags that still have not yet been picked up. We will have these available at report card pick up time and any that are not picked up will be taken apart and items that can be will be donated.

The big question: What will school look like in September?

The short answer is we don't know and most likely won't know for sure until August.

The two likely possibilities for September will be either:

- a) A full return to school as normal – Students attending five days a week and most business as usual with the possible exception of gatherings such as assemblies and community events

- b) A blended model much like we have right now - Grades K to 5 students will attend two days a week and Grades 6 & 7 students will attend one day a week. Online learning will continue for all. The difference for September, however, is that attendance will no longer be voluntary. All students will attend face to face instruction for the time they are allotted depending on their grade. Students of essential workers and those with special considerations (designations or severe learning needs) will be eligible to attend 5 days per week with Wednesdays continuing to be a daycare day.

The district takes its direction from the Ministries of Education and Health. After receiving those directions, Surrey School District makes its plans with consultation from many different groups. As we need to see where the state of things is before making decisions, August is most likely the soonest we would hear anything. As soon as I get the information, I will be forwarding it to our community. Jordan Tinney, our Superintendent, will continue to put out video messages with information as well. Please make sure you are signed up for emails and look at the website often over the summer. The school link app is also a great way to keep in the loop as any alerts the district or school sends out, automatically comes to you via that app.

Regardless of the model, your children will continue to receive the best education we can provide. Our teachers have done an amazing job with the very sudden pivot to online learning! You have all done a great job communicating with us and your teachers and working hard to teach and support your children. As we have discovered, our community can do whatever we put our minds to!
