We have a number of students who consistently arrive late to school. This week, we had an average of 37 late students per day. That is 15% of our population. Every student who is late has to get a welcome slip and be marked down by the office. It's a lot of unnecessary work and is not teaching students that being on time for important things (school being their job) is a vital life skill. We do completely recognize our parking and drop off situation is not great at all, in fact, it's quite problematic. However, the number of lates has drastically increased in the last few months. We ask that everyone work on reducing this number, possibly leaving home 5-10 mins earlier? Thank-you for your help on this.

### Mental Health and Covid:

We are definitely seeing the effects of Covid on the mental health of all of us including our kids. You may have noticed a difference in behaviour, mood, appetite, sleep or something else. Kids have a hard time understanding why they are feeling the way they are feeling, they just know something is wrong. # Students born in 2009 or earlier are now eligible to register on the B.C. COVID-19 Immunization website

Registration is now open for students between the ages of 12 and 17 to receive their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. On Thursday afternoon the province announced that children born in 2009 or earlier (12 and older) can register on the B.C. COVID-19 Immunization website. The goal is to have students vaccinated by June 30, with second doses by Aug. 30.

To register, fill out your child's information at <a href="mailto:getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca">getvaccinated.gov.bc.ca</a>, available 24/7 or call 1-833-838-2323 between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. any day of the week. You can also register in-person at any Service BC centre. After registering, you will receive a text, email or phone call when it is your turn to book a vaccine appointment. Don't expect to book an appointment the same day you register.

Once you have registered and have received your booking invitation, please do not delay booking an appointment. Bring your child's Care Card to their appointment. If your child does not have a personal health number, you can register by phone at 1-833-838-2323.

Booking invites will be sent to those who are older first, and most appointments will take place at the same immunization clinics used to vaccinate people in other age groups.
