## Message to Families

As we head into the final few weeks of school, I'd like to open with a number of staff and student appreciations.

Jerseys: I would like to take this opportunity to extend a most sincere thank you to the Randhawa and Johal families for kindly donating 40 new red/white reversible jerseys to the school. The jerseys come in a variety of sizes, numbered 1-40. When your child is selected to play or represent the school at an event please be sure to sign-out the jersey and return in good condition. All jerseys will be stored close to the office for safety and accountability.

Health & Safety: With the arrival of warm sunny days many students choose to wear open-toed sandals or flip-lops to school. However, the woodchips at the adventure playground and gravel areas can cause injury and make such footwear unsafe. Please send your child to school in a light-weight covered canvas shoe for safety. Finally don't forget to pack your child's water bottle and sunhat!

Seat Belt/Booster Seat Safety: While we are indebted to the many volunteer parent drivers at our school we need to ensure the safety of every child by following ICBC regulations as well as school district policy for safe transportation of young children. For children ages 4-9 years old, if the child is over 18 kg (40 lb) and under 145 cm (4'9") they must use a booster seat when traveling in a car, van or truck.



**Beach Day:** Sadly the planned Beach Day Field Trip had to be cancelled due to lack of parent drivers and adult supervisors. As enrollment at Clayton continues to steadily increase such events may need to be relocated to a closer venue to ensure the safety of all students.
