\$158,000 donation enables over 2,000 students from across the district to participate in sport- and art-based programs which aim to help students develop skills that contribute to a healthy life through creative thinking and physical activity. CANADIAN TIRE JUMPSTART CHARITIES



\$120,000 donation to the District's Jumpstart Academy Physical Literacy program. The donation allows students across 34 elementary schools participate safely in after school programming where they learn fundamental movement skills and the importance of healthy lifestyles.

COAST CAPITAL SAVINGS



\$45,000 was generously granted by Coast Capital Savings towards Building Foundations, Refugee Supports and the REACH Pre-Employment programs. REACH focuses on developing employment, life and leadership skills with over 150 students in Surrey between the ages of 15 to 18. All participating students gain essential pre-employment certifications that will help them secure employment, obtain work experience opportunities and develop skills in how to present themselves in an interview, how to build a proper resume, and develop their communication skills.

PARKRIDGE HOMES

\$16,000 was generously donated by Park Ridge Homes Inc. to support the breakfast and lunch programs at Bear Creek and Bridgeview elementary schools. This support helps students at both schools access nutritious meals daily.
