Invitation to Caregivers in Surrey - Skookum Lab April 11th & 23rd 5-8pm

On behalf of Skookum Lab, an invitation is extended to the **Caregivers of Indigenous children and youth in Surrey**. A Caregiver can be a parent, foster parent, or guardian of and Indigenous child. (see <u>poster</u>)

What is the Skookum Lab initiative?

Skookum lab is an initiative of the Surrey Urban Indigenous Leadership Committee that is building solutions to the high rates of Indigenous child and youth poverty in Surrey. We recognize that solutions that are community-based are often more successful and have longer-lasting impacts than those that are prescribed. Part of the process to build solutions is through the development of Guide Groups. Skookum Lab Guide Groups consist of four groups:

- Elders
- Youth
- Care Givers
- Community Workers

What is a Guide Group?

A Guide Group is a network of community members who can support each other and the Skookum Lab Process to find relevant and meaningful solutions to Indigenous child and youth poverty. We will have 2 – 3 meetings before May and after that 1 meet every 3-4 months for 2 years. For every meeting Guide Group Members will receive bus tickets, a meal and a gift card.

Why are we doing this?

Over the years, census data has revealed Indigenous demographics in Surrey such as:

Almost half of the Indigenous population is under the age of 25. The Surrey- Indigenous population is the fastest growing urban Indigenous population in BC.

However, data also shows that:

•45% of Indigenous children in Surrey live in poverty, which is higher than the poverty rate for off-reserve Indigenous children in Canada.

This is an issue that needs immediate attention. When the urban Indigenous community thrives, a ripple effect is felt throughout the community.

Plenty of Threads Project – For Youth in or from Care (ages 19-27)

The purpose of the Plenty of Threads program is to connect youth from care with people in the community who can act as resources, sources of information and connections for youth to build their networks in support of employment and education opportunities.

Plenty of Threads will provide a program structure and set up the conditions to enable one-on-one, 1-hour coffee meetings between youth from care and respected adults in the community. This project builds off the "human library" concept by providing youth with a variety of interesting people (ie. the "books"), that they can "check-out" to learn from the education and career experience of individuals they may not have otherwise met.

They're looking to recruit a small group of youth to participate in the project who will receive:

- Training/ Orientation (free food provided!)
- Coffee gift cards
- The chance to meet and chat with 3 different adults to chat about career/education experiences
- A wrap-up celebration for all participants (more free food!)
