- **Creative Coders** clubs: Grades 4-5, 2 sessions: Jan 20 Feb 10 & Feb 17 Mar 10, Wednesdays 3:30-5pm (online)
- **STEAM clubs**: Grade 5-6, 2 sessions: Jan 19 Feb 9 & Feb 16 Mar 9, Tuesdays 3:30-5pm (online). In addition to oline work, Geering Up will be mailing packages of supplies to participants

Registration and requirements:

- Each of the programs has room for 16 participants: children must attend all 4 sessions in their program.
