# FYI - Ancient Medicine Wheel – 1000 years older than Stonehenge

When talking about territorial acknowledgment, it helps to remind listeners that Indigenous people have lived on this land for a long time. The Majorville Medicine Wheel (Iniskim Umaapi), 2 hours south-east of Calgary is a good example of this. It was constructed over the span of a few thousand years. Its first stones were placed by ancestors of the Blackfoot approximately 5,000 years ago. Which means the wheel is 1,000 years older than Stonehenge, 3,500 years older than the Mayan Pyramid of Chichen Itza, and 500 years older than the Great Pyramid of Giza.
