Rec 4 Youth is an outreach and engagement tool providing youth with 4 free visits to any City of Surrey recreation facility drop-in activities (swimming, skating – including helmet and skate rentals, weight room, drop-in fitness classes, drop-in gym activities). Passes are distributed by City of Surrey staff and youth serving organizations. The goal is to introduce youth between the ages of 10 to 18 to recreation opportunities. This supports vulnerable youth who are not currently accessing recreation services and aims to reduce barriers to access positive activities that enhance health, personal competence, and resiliency.
