Page Program Recruitment Campaign - September 23rd to November 11th, 2019

The official launch of the recruitment campaign for the **House of Commons Page Program** 2020-21 academic year will take place from September 23 to November 11, 2019.

Each year, 40 students graduating from high schools and CEGEPs from across Canada are recruited to participate in the House of Commons Page Program. **Students who maintain a minimum average of 80% and can speak both official languages are invited to apply.** To be selected, they must also be accepted in a full-time program at a university in the National Capital Region.

Pages work directly on the floor of the House of Commons and are responsible for a wide range of tasks related to Chamber activities. This provides them with the opportunity to broaden their knowledge of Parliament by playing a role in the rich traditions of the Canadian parliamentary system.

This year, it is hoped to increase the number of applications received by Indigenous students.
